Frequently Asked Questions about the Facilities Bond Election

What is a Levy? Bond?

- Levies are for learning and Bonds are for buildings.
- An operating levy are funds that the district uses to run and operate its schools. Levies are for running the educational programs at the school and funds go to the district's general fund.
- Bond levies are for funds that the school district uses for new construction, updates to existing facilities, and other additions to school properties.

When will this be done?

- With a favorable vote in November, we will begin design work the summer of 2020. Completion will be done in the summer of 2022! Many of the improvements will be done during the summer months. A safe learning environment will be provided for all students during any work done while school is in session.

Can I vote absentee?

- Yes, absentee voting is permitted beginning September 20th. Contact the County Auditor or visit our district website for information: www.jccschools.com

Will construction be done by a local company?

- Under state law, any project with a value greater than \$100,000 must be publicly bid and awarded to the lowest bidder. Local preference is not permitted. We will hold pre-bid meetings so local contractors are informed of the projects.

What are the district's options if we don't pass a referendum?

- If the November referendum fails, we will continue to spend money out of our operating budget each year for repairs and maintenance. The School Board will redesign the project with community input and write a new plan.
