Favorite football team: MN Vikings

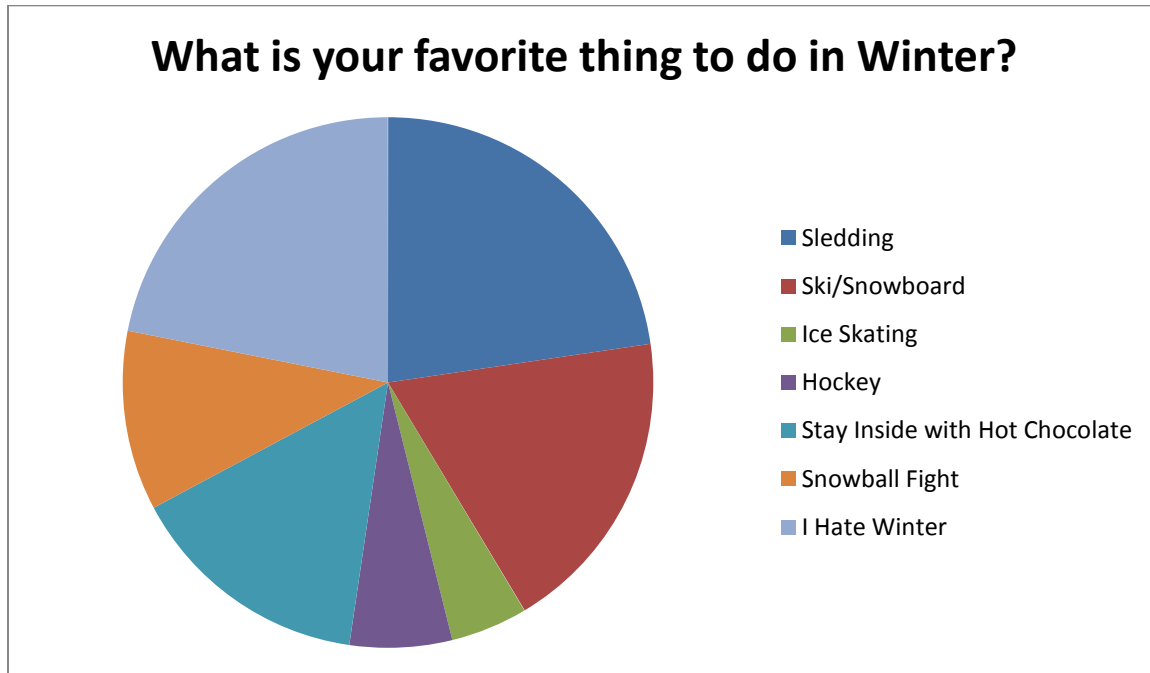

JCCMS Band & Choir Concert

Monday, February 22, 2010 at 7:30 P.M.

JCCMS bands and choirs will strut their stuff Monday, February 22, 2010 at 7:30 P.M. The concert was rescheduled due to snow days.

The 6th grade choir will sing two pieces: "Take a Winter Walk with Me" and "No School Tomorrow". 7th graders will also sing two winter-themed songs: "Winter Wonderland" and "Winter Song". 8th grade choir will perform "The Road Less Traveled" (a piece inspired by the Robert Frost poem) and "Old King Cole". Mr. McConnell conducts all three choirs. JCC Senior Andrew Paulson is the accompanist. Mr. McConnell told The Paw Print the choirs have had fewer rehearsals this trimester due to the show days and late starts.

The 6th grade band will perform three pieces at the concert: "BB Rock", "Beethoven's 9th" and "Supercalifragilisticexpialidocious". 7th and 8th grade band will play "Chant and Tribal Dance", "España Caña" and "Planets" (Venus, Mars and Jupiter). The 19 members of the middle school Jazz Band will perform "Jericho" and "C Jam Blues". The bands are conducted by Mr. Grupe. Mr. Grupe told The Paw Print the bands are having a lot of fun; they have learned a lot of music in a short time, considering the snow days and late starts". Grupe added, "It's nice to see them so something like "Planets", which is a standard of orchestral literature. These kids never cease to amaze me. They are willing to try new things."
